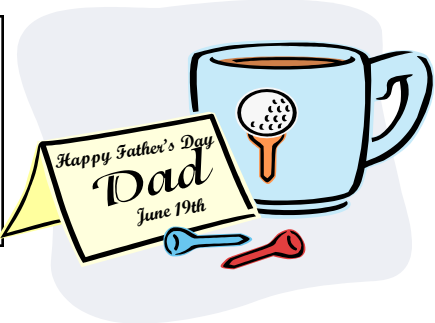

THE PASTOR'S THOUGHTS....

Dear Family of faith,

Patience is a virtue, and I've lost mine! Lately I've been talking a lot more to the drivers ahead of me on the road—not that they can hear me, of course; but it makes me feel better to yell and call them names from the safety of my car. I have my own private road rage episodes when slow drivers pull out in front of me on a state highway and proceed to drive twenty miles under the speed limit...or when someone with a cell phone stuck to his ear gets in the passing lane on the Suncoast tollway and prevents me from getting around the traffic...or when a driver speeds up just when I'm passing, forcing me to 'play chicken' on the road. What's a nice Christian pastor to do when my thoughts aren't very nice and my silent vocabulary isn't very Christian?

I also get frustrated with people who don't seem to want to get out of the ruts they are in—people who seem to delight in being able to complain about life yet refuse to accept advice that would help them move on to better days. I've also lost my patience with politicians who continue to rob from the poor to keep the rich richer, with educated people who pretend that environmental scientists don't know what they're talking about when it comes to global warming and pollution, and with church-going people who continue to use culture-based biblical mandates from thousands of years ago to reject and abuse people today. I've lost my patience with an electorate that seems to choose its leaders based not on the ability to govern, but on whether or not they agree with a particular religious persuasion and follow certain personal preferences—and that only when it's convenient! I've lost my patience with insurance companies that have the right to drop your coverage when you actually want to claim what is legally yours, with drug companies that charge exorbitant prices for medicines that take pennies to produce, and with oil companies that make billions of dollars in profit and yet

whine about losing subsidies from the government. Yes, if patience is a virtue, then I've lost my virtue. What's a body to do?

Whenever I get into a funk about something, I look to Jesus for answers. It's not that Jesus never lost his patience—he did once when the vendors in the temple turned the prayer area for the Gentiles into a three-ring circus with their business ventures. Yet mostly Jesus went about the countryside seeming very calm and unrattled by the turmoil around him. What was his secret? For one thing, Jesus never seemed to be in a hurry. He never had a watch or a schedule to follow. He knew what he wanted to do and where he wanted to go, but he never set deadlines and appointments. My road rage episodes are usually related to being in a hurry to get somewhere. It comes down to planning. I need to stop over-booking and double-booking my time and leave more "breathing space" in between my activities. As far as the political and social issues of his day, Jesus refused to be drawn into such debates. He cared about the people who needed his love and compassion, not about the aspirations of ladder-climbing businessmen or political figures. Jesus had focus—he knew what he was all about and he didn't let himself get side-tracked. He also had a perspective that allowed him to trust God to bring about righteousness and justice in the end. It's the same thing we pray for every Sunday morning in the Lord's Prayer when we say, "Thy kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven." When I get frustrated over the politics of the day or the "business as usual" policies of big corporations, I need to let go of my anger and realize that God takes care of things in the end. Injustice and corruption will destroy itself; greed will destroy itself; only good will survive.

I may be your pastor, but I'm still on the journey with God just like you. Next time you think of me, pray for my patience.

FOOTSTEPS TO SCHOOL SNEAKER PROJECT SHOES FOR NEEDY KIDS

A big heartfelt thanks go to the many people who purchased sneakers or donated money for us to buy sneakers for this ongoing outreach project. A large variety of styles and sizes of brand new sneakers are available to needy children; the shoes are stored in a portable located at Fox Chapel School.

On August 22 children will be returning to school and, once again, we would like to purchase sneakers and socks for needy children in the University of Florida Nurturing Program and any specific homeless child in need. Names, ages, and sizes will be given to us by the UF Hernando County parent educators or Shanika Figueroa, homeless student liaison for the Hernando County School Board. A display board will be posted in the Narthex the end of July and will remain until school starts. You will be invited to pick a name of a specific child and asked to purchase that child a pair of sneakers and a package of socks, or you could make a monetary donation and we, the sub-committee, will do the shopping. Following is an excerpt from The Church, by Hans Kung:

“The Spirit is thus the earthly presence of the glorified Lord. In the Spirit Christ becomes Lord of his Church, and in the Spirit the resurrected Lord acts both in the

community and in the individual. The power of his resurrection is more than a power of ecstasy and miracle; it produces a new creation. The Spirit opens up for the believer the way to the saving action of God in Christ. He does this not as a magic power which man cannot resist; he creates the possibility of man's replying with a responsible and conscious affirmative. He gives him, through the knowledge of the crucified Christ, the realization that in Jesus Christ God acted for him. The Spirit gives faith in the cross and resurrection of Christ and gives the power to live a life of faith. He is the “spirit of faith”. The Spirit is not man's own potential, but entirely the gift, the power and strength of God. The Holy Spirit, as God's Spirit, must be distinguished from man's own spirit, since he is the Holy Spirit, free from all sin. The Holy Spirit is always entirely God's Spirit and is not absorbed into the individual spirit of man. At the same time, God's spirit can win power and dominion over man, so that he becomes man's inner self, so that a man no longer lives by his own strength, but by God's.”

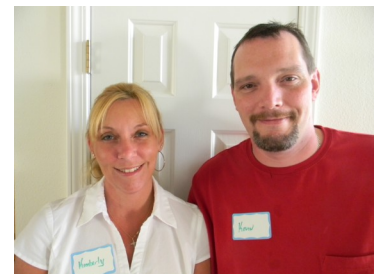

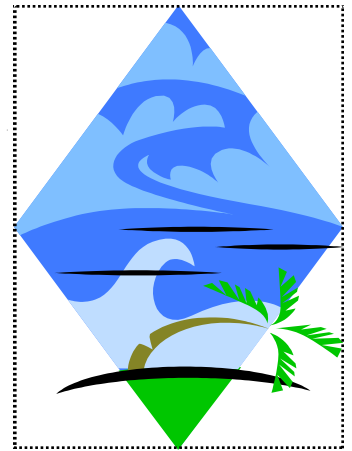

BE PREPARED

HURRICANE - DISASTER SUPPLY KIT

(Season runs from June 1st thru November 30th)

- Water** - at least 1 gallon daily per person for 3 to 7 days
- Food** - at least enough for 3 to 7 days
 - non-perishable packaged or canned food / juices
 - foods for infants or the elderly
 - snack foods
 - non-electric can opener
 - cooking tools / fuel
 - paper plates / plastic utensils
- Blankets / Pillows, etc.**
- Clothing** - seasonal / rain gear/ sturdy shoes
- First Aid Kit / Medicines / Prescription Drugs**
- Special Items** - for babies and the elderly
- Toiletries / Hygiene items / Moisture wipes**
- Flashlight / Batteries**
- Radio** - Battery operated and NOAA weather radio
- Telephones** - Fully charged cell phone with extra battery and a traditional (not cordless) telephone set
- Cash (with some small bills) and Credit Cards** - Banks and ATMs may not be available for extended periods
- Keys**
- Toys, Books and Games**
- Important documents** - in a waterproof container or watertight resealable plastic bag
 - insurance, medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card, etc.
- Tools** - keep a set with you during the storm
- Vehicle fuel tanks filled**
- Pet care items**
 - proper identification / immunization records / medications
 - ample supply of food and water
 - a carrier or cage
 - muzzle and leash

BE PART OF GENERAL SYNOD 28



The Florida Conference is hosting General Synod in Tampa, July 1-5, 2011. Synod meets every two years and is a gathering of people delegated by our 38 Conferences to represent the United Church of Christ and to address important matters relating to the church. Participants also include visitors from UCC churches; local, conference and national UCC staff; representatives from many diverse UCC institutions, agencies and ministries; and friends and colleagues from other faith traditions. It is an opportunity to participate in meaningful worship, see how the UCC works from the inside out, hear dynamic speakers, renew old friendships and make new friends, and celebrate the various UCC institutions, agencies and ministries.

Be a part of this as a Synod volunteer. Volunteers are asked to commit to one or more four-hour shifts. Everyone who attends Synod must register and pay a registration fee. The fee for a volunteer is \$100 (50% of the regular registration fee and entitles you to attend all activities and events, except those that are only open to delegates).

Here are some of the ways Synod volunteers will assist:

- Staff information booth at the Convention Center and hotels
- Assist Registrar of General Synod at the registration area
- Floor Stewards assist in floor management of Synod sessions
- Youth Stewards (14 – 18 years old) help during all plenary sessions
- Assist participants with special needs to fully participate in the activities Synod
- Children's Program and Child Care volunteers provide child care for infants through 5th graders
- Worship Ushers

You will find additional volunteer opportunities listed on the registration site (see below).

Thousands of cookies will also be needed and churches will be receiving information about how they can share the love by baking cookies!
