THE PASTOR'S THOUGHTS....

Dear Family of Faith,
 Nobody listens to anyone anymore! I was reminded of that again at a recent meeting that I attended. Everyone seemed to be talking at once, and the topic of conversation changed more frequently than the scenes on a music video. At one point someone asked, "What are we talking about?" No one seemed to be sure!

When people, especially children, have difficulty focusing their attention on things, they are often diagnosed as having Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) or Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). Yet sometimes I wonder whether our whole society is ADD when it comes to listening to others. Maybe this is why compromise is so lacking in every venue of life from government to marriage. Nobody gets what the other party is trying to say! Isn't this lack of listening and understanding what has fueled the uprisings in Egypt and Libya, Bahrain and Iran? For years the people were speaking and the governments weren't listening. Isn't this intransigence in attitude why the Democratic lawmakers in Wisconsin have fled the state to avoid voting to negate bargaining rights for the teachers' union as proposed by the Republicans in that state? No one is listening; it's the attitude of "my way or the highway."

We will never solve this world's social or political problems by running away from them. Yet if we have no listening skills, we won't be able even to understand those with whom we disagree. Dear Friends, there is a reason that we have two ears and only one mouth! The wisest people I have known in my life are those who listen long before they speak; and, when they do speak, what they say is usually worth hearing.

Maybe in this world that seems ever more impersonal we feel like our identity and worth are disappearing. Maybe we feel that we are becoming less and less relevant in the grand scheme of things, and such a frightening thought makes us determined to tell everyone we can what we think and know. Admittedly

it's a tough place to be—especially if you are an introvert. We feel stuck between a nebulous, meaningless existence and a boisterous, out-of-character self-promotion that goes against everything we ever learned about humility from the Bible. What are we to do? How can we stop dominating conversations and 'shutting down' the voices of others with our insistent talking? How can we ever understand one another?

I have two suggestions. First of all, we need to seek peace—inner peace. We can let go of our campaigns of self-aggrandizement if we are confident of our value as persons. As Christians our self-esteem and self-worth come not from any worldly acclaim or accomplishment, but rather from our identity as God's children and from God's love for us. We need to carve out quiet moments of reflection in our days when we can be quiet in God's presence and so remember who we are and that inner affirmation of God's care for us. God loves us not for what we say or do, but simply because we *are*. Knowing that amazing grace allows us to be silent. We don't have to promote our opinions or get our own way. After all, why would we get anxious or upset over what has no bearing on our worth?

Secondly, we need to get some perspective. We need to step back and see what really matters in the end. Does it matter if a room is painted blue or green? Does it matter if we eat chicken or pork for dinner? Does it matter if something costs \$10 or \$12? Not in the end! And even if we are "right," and others are mistaken, I have found that a peace-filled relationship is always worth more than the strife that comes from a verbal battle over whose ideas are best.

Peace and perspective help us listen to each other. Does this mean, then, that we should never speak, never share our good ideas and dreams? Of course not! It only means that letting others share is just as important as our own sharing, and one person speaking at a time is just common courtesy. I think we all learned that in Kindergarten...or weren't we listening?

Endowment Committee News

The Endowment Committee held its first meeting of the year on February 16, 2011. Newly elected chairperson, Linda Hamilton, welcomed members George Bulau, Richard Hackl, Dave Malaby, and brand new church member and Endowment Committee member Gail Calvi-MacConnell to the team. Sue Mattson joined in on behalf of the Stewardship Committee. The Endowment Committee is responsible for building, investing and caring for Spring Hill United Church of Christ's Endowment Fund.

For those of you who do not know what an Endowment Fund is it is a fund that allows non-profit institutions like churches (you probably get calls from your college to support their endowment funds) to direct money to agreed needs and to become sustainable with no financial worries down the road. Our endowment fund at SHUCC is in its baby years and in 2006 passed a major milestone in reaching \$25,000. Today it sits at over \$35,000. We want it to grow even more!

How do Endowment Funds grow? They are funded by donations and are tax deductible. How do we make sure it continues to grow? By continuing to receive donations and only spending a limited amount of the interest as approved by the Church Council.

In 2010 the SHUCC Endowment Fund helped fund a seminary student, the roof on the Fellowship Hall, the roof on the Davis Hall and a small gift to Habitat for Humanity. Thank you to all those who gave to the Endowment Fund long ago for their belief in the future!

Our committee will be brainstorming ways we can grow the Endowment Fund and will be keeping you posted on our progress.

For your Lenten meditation, the following is an

excerpt from Sermons, by Peter Gomes:

"The one who is rich toward God, Jesus says, is the one who recognizes here and now that treasure is not in what one has, or even in what one leaves or gives away, or even in what one does. Those are not riches. Treasure is in who one is, and ultimately that treasure is defined in terms of the relationship one has with God. Treasure is knowing that one belongs not to self, or to work, or vocation, or ambition, but that one belongs to God. You don't belong to your talent or to your skill or identity in the world. Treasure is knowing that you belong to God; treasure is knowing that you are therefore not alone. You are not isolated, you are not on your own. Treasure is in knowing that you are loved, and that you love because you are loved, and that knowledge of self and relationship and purpose is what treasure is all about. Treasure means rich in relationship to God, that which the world cannot give and which, therefore, the world and all of its adversities and trials and tribulations cannot take away. The one who would then be truly rich is the one who cultivates that treasure, that knowledge, and who does so with all of the effort that other people use to cultivate earthly but perishable goods. So that when you leave "everything", as we all most certainly will leave everything, you can take "it" with you, for it is the only thing you ever truly had, and that is the love of God."

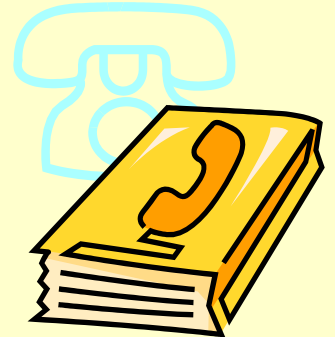

M **MISSION TEAM DOINGS...** The Mission team met at the home of the Chair, Hazel McElroy, in February. Amid the fellowship in a less formal gathering, the team reviewed the many causes which had been supported in 2010 as well as the activities and projects.

S We will be continuing in 2011 our support of the UCC 5 for 5 ministries which are: OCWM (receives \$100.00 monthly); One Great Hour of Sharing in April (in which the congregation is invited to also donate); Strengthen the Church in June; Neighbors in Need in October; and the Christmas Fund in December (in which the congregation is invited to also donate). Other ongoing ministries we will support are Back Bay Mission in Biloxi; and locally, Habitat for Humanity and the food banks of DayStar and Salvation Army.

The committee heard directly from the School Liaison for the Homeless who needed sneakers in sizes not available. Even as this is written, those sneakers are being purchased with the project funds and will be taken to the portable where clothing supplies are kept.

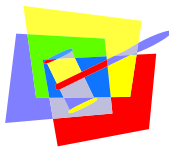

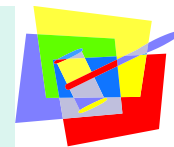

Last fall marked the start of a new era in the Florida tomato industry as many retailers and tomato growers reached fair food agreements which included passing on a penny per pound of tomatoes from retailers to farm workers and enforcing a strict code of conduct against abuses. Unfortunately, calling on the supermarket industry to join in these agreements has not been easy. In fact, earlier this year a Publix spokesperson explained the company’s position with brutal

honesty: **“We don’t have any plans to sit down with the CIW [Coalition of Immokalee Workers]. If there are some atrocities going on, it’s not our business.**

On Saturday, March 5, several members of our social justice team will join farm workers and their families in Tampa to call on Publix to “do the right thing” for those who pick its tomatoes. BE PART OF GENERAL SYNOD 28



The Florida Conference is hosting General Synod in Tampa, July 1-5, 2011. Synod meets every two years and is a gathering of people delegated by our 38 Conferences to represent the United Church of Christ and to address important matters relating to the church. Participants also include visitors from UCC churches; local, conference and national UCC staff; representatives from many diverse UCC institutions, agencies and ministries; and friends and colleagues from other faith traditions. It is an opportunity to participate in meaningful worship, see how the UCC works from the inside out, hear dynamic speakers, renew old friendships and make new friends, and celebrate the various UCC institutions, agencies and ministries.

Be a part of this as a Synod volunteer. Volunteers are asked to commit to one or more four-hour shifts. Everyone who attends Synod must register and pay a registration fee. The fee for a volunteer is \$100 (50% of the regular registration fee and entitles you to attend all activities and events, except those that are only open to delegates).

Here are some of the ways Synod volunteers will assist:

- Staff information booth at the Convention Center and hotels
- Assist Registrar of General Synod at the registration area
- Floor Stewards assist in floor management of Synod sessions
- Youth Stewards (14 – 18 years old) help during all plenary sessions
- Assist participants with special needs to fully participate in the activities Synod
- Children's Program and Child Care volunteers provide child care for infants through 5th graders
- Worship Ushers

You will find additional volunteer opportunities listed on the registration site (see below).

Thousands of cookies will also be needed and churches will be receiving information about how they can share the love by baking cookies!
